
Structure of Antibody–Drug Conjugates

Tumor antigen: abundant in tumours, minimal in normal tissues; internalised

Antibody: high affinity, avidity for antigen; optimal PK; internalised

Linker: stable in plasma; efficient release of cytotoxic agent inside tumour cells

Payload: drug cytotoxic to targeted tumour cells; must be potent since limited number of molecules can be attached to antibody



Breast Screening

- **X** BSA Programme needs update
 - - » High density increases risk of BC, masks tumours on mammograms
 - » We have a right to be told
 - » Know if we need more surveillance
 - » Avoid late detection
 - » Submission to BSA
 - - » Cross-party support for Reti Bill to extend to 74
 - ⋈ Implement smarter risk-based screening




BCAC's Superpower

Alison Davies, pharmaco-economist

- X Rare and treasured expertise
 - ⋈ Only a handful in NZ
- V Understands medicines

 - ⊠ Benefits and risks
- X Understands Pharmac
 - Writes our medicine funding applications at no cost
- Founding BCAC committee member& BC survivor so totally 'gets it'









- Keytruda (pembrolizumab)
 - ≈ 2022 Pharmac application to fund for early and advanced TNBC, MSD in June 2023
 - » Considered by CTAC Oct 2023
 - » Minutes take 4 months....
 - » Funded in Australia Sept 2023 for advanced, soon to fund for early

X Halaven (Eribulin)


- ≈ 2022 Pharmac application as a later line treatment in ABC
 - » PTAC declined for ridiculous reasons
 - » We appealed and successfully sought CTAC review
 - » CTAC recommended decline
 - » Funded in Australia since 2013





- X Teva Goserelin replaced with Zoladex
 - Blocks oestrogen production in pre-menopausal women

 - ⋈ Pharmac listened, acknowledged patient advocacy!
 - X A rare success



- - » 5 funded, all safe and effective
- - » In all international guidelines, adopted in all countries
 - » we're disputing this with BCF









× Enhertu

- - » We urged Medsafe to speed up
- ⊠ Given high priority by Pharmac's CTAC in Aug 2023
- Still not on Pharmac's Options for Investment list
- ⋈ HER2 low will follow

X Trodelvy

- ⋈ Promises broken on registration, cost share







- X Afinitor (everolimus)
 - XX BCAC applied to Pharmac in 2018
 - » PTAC declined in 2019
 - » Australia funded in 2014
 - » Approached by patient needing access
 - » We asked Novartis for compassionate access, price cap and reduced price
 - » They initiated a 30% price reduction





X My Life Matters campaign



You are one diagnosis away from moving to Australia There is an unfunded medicines crisis in New Zealand Our politicians need to act now to save lives

Seeking:

- Increased investment, timely access to medicines, parity with other OECD countries
- Patient-focused wellbeing benefits included in decision-making processes



How is breast cancer doing?

- X 18 ABC medicines recommended in international guidelines that Pharmac doesn't fund
- × 12 of these are funded in Australia:
 - Abraxane, Afinitor, Avastin, Enhertu, Halaven, retreatment with Herceptin/Herzuma, Keytruda, Kisqali, Tecentriq, Trodelvy, Tykerb, Verzenio
- X All subtypes miss out
- Marion's paper:
 - Treating advanced breast cancer in New Zealand – do we match other countries?

NZ is dead last










Kiwis are missing out on life saving medicines. NZ is at the bottom of the OECD for public funding of medicines.

Other submissions

- Precision Health (MoH)
 - Opportunities to improve healthcare in Aotearoa through the uptake of innovative technologies
- Proposal to stop funding child cancer medicines (Pharmac)
 - We objected, this should be a model for all cancers and other diseases
- Women's Health Strategy (MoH)
 - Asked that breast cancer be specifically covered
 - X Action points:
 - » Modernise screening
 - » Improve medicines access
 - » Increase precision
- ★ Therapeutic Products Bill
 - □ Disputed clauses that threatened:
 - » Importation of unregistered medicines
 - » Advocacy and communication on unregistered medicines
 - » Timely access to clinical trials



Revision of BCAC Constitution

× Reasons for revision:

- Recent changes to the Incorporated Societies and Charities Acts require us to review our Rules (Constitution)
